

Life In The Contest World - Mackenzie Johnston

I first competed at the COTFA (Colorado Old Time Fiddlers Association) contest in the Small Fry Division at age 7. Ever since then, my teacher, Katie Glassman, and I have been preparing yearly for that contest. In 2012, I won first place in the Junior, Junior division, which gave me the motivation to go to Weiser, Idaho, the National Contest. At Weiser I placed 4th nationally.

Because of Katie's commitment to teaching me contest fiddling, I have always placed in the top 3.


Contest fiddling has taught me:

- To always plan ahead. In order to keep up with schoolwork and progress in fiddling, managing time and setting priorities is crucial.
- 2. Listening to specific genres and the "greats" in each genre allows me to imitate their style.
- 3. Contests are great motivation to refine every element of the tune. They are also opportunities to share how you have progressed over the past year with your peers and the audience.
- Contest fiddling is a family affair. It is good to know that because my sisters also play, there will always be a common bond shared through music.
- 5. The audience is there for support not criticism. That knowledge has helped me, as I have grown up, to eliminate anxiety as I perform.
- Placing isn't the point of contests. Setting goals, learning new tunes and expanding musically feeds the heart of a musician regardless of how you place. It is truly a personal journey for the joy of music.

I am grateful for the support that my family and teachers give me.

Colorado Dulcimer Festival – A Success In Its New Littleton Location

The Colorado Dulcimer Festival moved this year from Ft. Collins to St. James Presbyterian Church in Littleton. Festival planners were nervous about the move and the new site/logistics, but it all worked! The venue was excellent and the festival was a great success.

Nearly 100 mountain and hammered dulcimer players participated in two days of workshops for all skill levels, as well as pre-festival workshops taught by our featured out-of-state instructors/performers Guy George on hammered dulcimer and Heidi Muller on mountain dulcimer. Other instructors included national champions Tina Gugeler, Karen Alley, Bonnie Carol and Steve Eulberg. In addition to the classes, there were jam sessions and a band scramble (where participants form ad hoc groups, practice briefly, and perform); a festival store selling CDs, books, and other items from the instructors; and sales tables from local music businesses. The caterer did a great job and on-site meals offered participants time to get to know one another outside the classes and jams.

Friday and Saturday night concerts were open to the general public as well as attendees, and were a highlight of the festival. (The church has an excellent sound system and technician!) The new location and successful advertising brought a record number of attendees to the concerts. Half of the instructors performed each night, so the two concerts were entirely different, and the variety of styles and instruments was energizing. If you've never heard mountain dulcimer with soprano sax, for instance, this would have been your chance. By late Saturday night it was all over until next time.

The Festival Planning Team will be working through the year to make next year's festival even better. Put Friday and Saturday, February 5-6, 2016 on your calendar. Come and try your hand at mountain or hammered dulcimer; there are beginner and brand-new-beginner classes in both. It would be just great to have a fiddle or two in the band scramble! Or just come and enjoy the evening concerts.

I started a little string orchestra at Swallow Hill in Denver about a year and a half ago, and we've been having a great time!
