Rocky Mountain Fiddle Club Celebrates its First Year

Every second Sunday of the month, Scottish music erupts from the fingers of the Rocky Mountain Fiddle Club, often right here in Niwot. The Jigs make the players' pulses race and the Reels thrum in their ears. In the words of Rocky Mountain Fiddle Club founder, Arlene Patterson, the spirit of the club is "happy."

Rocky Mountain Fiddle Club was founded in October 2013 as a way for local Scottish fiddlers to connect and play. A typical session involves splitting into two groups to jam, one for fast pace and the other for slow. Afterwards, a short meeting is held to talk about upcoming performances

or other special events. Following the meeting is a workshop where people share about anything related to the club or the art of fiddling. Wrapping up the evening, members enjoy a potluck.

Fiddle Club doesn't dissuade anyone from joining the music-making madness, and includes many instruments other than the fiddle. Any age is welcome, with a range for the group from under eight to over 70, and any ability level is invited to play. Beginners can simply play an open string, while advanced players can play the melody, create a harmony, or add accompaniment.

During class, we'll learn tunes and backup techniques including chopping, designed to feel the rhythm and pulse behind the music. I want to do more than just learn tunes, I want to teach you how to feel the pulse and make your music sound dancelike.
